Our January month-end bank balance was \$4990.86 We have \$454.09 in outstanding checks; We gave a \$300 gift to Good Hope, for use of their meeting room. \$104.09 was paid out for newsletter printing, and office supplies. We paid a \$50 Membership in Dearborn Community Arts Council, from which we get play dates. We deposited \$40 of membership dues. Our checking balance is now \$4576.77

On a more exciting note; on Saturday February 12, several from SSDS attended Uncle Carl's Dulcimer Club in Spring Arbor, west of Jackson. The club has a very nice jam format. The first hour is slow jam (very helpful and enjoyable for newer players). A short business meeting followed, with a break after for refreshments.
