Recípe for:	Pumpkín	Crunch

<u>Línda Osgood</u>

1 yellow cake míx 1 15 oz. can pumpkín 1 12 oz. can evaporated mílk 3 lg. eggs 1 ½ c. sugar 1 tsp. cínnamon ½ tsp. salt ½ c. chopped pecans 1 c. oleo

Combine pumpkin, mílk, eggs, sugar, cinnamon and salt. Pour into greased 9x13" pan. Sprinkle dry cake míx over pumpkin míxture. Top with nuts. Drízzle melted oleo over. Bake at 350 for 1 hour. Can be made a day before.


