Slow Jam – we are looking for someone or a couple of people to take turns to lead "slow" jams for newer players, players who are learning a new instrument or people who enjoy a slower pace. Ann Wassell has graciously done this for a while but is stepping back. Consider whether you can contribute to the club in this way and let Terry K. know if you would do this.

Library Outreach Program – Warren Public Library Auditorium, October 23 @ 6:00 pm, 1 City Square, Warren MI. There is still room for more to participate. See the signup sheet. The auditorium can accommodate a big group. If you have an extra dulcimer, please bring it. In consideration of traffic, we will plan to go over early, have something to eat nearby and then go over to unload. We will meet at the delivery door on the east side of the building to unload our instruments and then go park.

One more program is scheduled for this year — Allen Park Library, December 3 @ 6:00 pm, 8100 Allen Rd., (corner of Champagne), Allen Park. This is a smaller library and so will need to keep the group to about 10 people (at least 5 dulcimers). Sign-up sheet is available. Playlist stays the same 10 tunes.

Rick Thum Workshop/Concert—November 4, 2017 - see flyer in the newsletter for details. There are three workshops. If you are not taking classes, there will be jamming in the basement from 2:00 to 4:00. After the jam those of us who want to can head out to dinner and come back for Rick's concert in the sanctuary and "afterglow" jam in the fellowship hall.

Holiday Music preparation- there will be 3-4 rehearsals. If you plan to play at any of the performances, please try to make as many of the rehearsals as possible. This helps us mesh as a group. One goal is to have two people be able to do

each start (and perhaps alternate starting them) so that not only do we expand the number of people who start but are prepared if the usual starter is not there. At the time of this writing, I cannot tell you what new tunes will be added. The new tunes being considered are: Parade of the Wooden Soldiers, Do You Hear What I Hear? PostScript to HOLIDAY MUSIC: A good sized group came to the 2017 review of holiday music Sept. 28. We worked on starts and designated more than one starter for most of the tunes (good plan if someone can't be there). We also looked at the potential new tunes. The group wants to attempt Hallelujah. While not difficult there are rhythm challenges. Please check Dropbox. Karen will put a midi-file in of that piece for you to listen and practice with. Those who have paper copies please verify you have the version we are playing. Sometimes we change the key we are playing

SSDS Music – It seems every so often in a jam we are NOT ALL ON THE SAME PAGE. It seems to depend on when you got your SSDS music and whether you have kept up with the updates. Over the years a tune may be changed – sometimes a note, sometimes a change in chording or other "correction." It happened recently with Kentucky Waltz. Some were playing a 2010 version and others a 2013 version. Please go through your music and check it against the revision list that is posted in Dropbox. Make sure you have the latest version so we are ALL PLAYING ON THE SAME PAGE.

- Ding Dong Merrily 4 count start done by the chimes/triangle.
- God Rest Ye Guitar start. All end w/single chord. Play this <u>4</u> times.
- O Come All Ye Faithful the chorus starts out soft, with each phrase a little louder.
- Watch the dynamics—We Three Kings part should be played a little softer than the Carol of the Bells.
- Joy to the World $\underline{4}$ measure start and resemble church bells ringing.
- Simple Gifts make note we are playing it 2 in D/1 in G.
- Santa Claus is coming: first time slow, second time peppy, third time jazzy.
- "Rockin' Round the Christmas Tree end with single D to allow tag ending to be heard.
- Hallelujah by L. Cohen unlikely we will do it this season but am introducing it in hopes to add next year.
- What Child is This in a new key from what SSDS has done before.


