

Performance Notes:

Ann Arbor District Library – outreach program. We had a small audience, but very interested in our instruments. There were 10 of us who played and brought a variety of instruments and as it turned out our hammered dulcimers were representative of 7 different builders – that was great! One of the women present has a HD that has been collecting dust in her closet. We may see her at our jam as she is ready to try playing again.

Myers Lake Music – Hope you plan to come to Myers Lake at least for one day (Saturday). If you can come for the entire event, that is even better. Thanks to all who will be leading workshops: Harmonicas, Mountain Dulcimer, Ukulele, HD, Medieval Music for Bowed Psaltery and Recorders.

Friday afternoon, I invite people to a tune sharing gathering. If you are there, bring something you have picked up in a different jam or in your travels and some copies (10?) to share. There is an organized jam in the barn Friday evening.

We expect guests from other clubs and members who are coming for the first time. Let's be gracious hosts and answer questions, invite them to sit with you, etc. Pitch in to help where you can – set up for meals, help with the Saturday breakfast, etc. Attached is the tentative schedule.

Tune of the Month — "Out on Lake Michigan" - my vacation gift to you for "summertime when the living is easy" and you find yourself at one of our beautiful lakes. I picked this tune not only because it feels like summer to me, but it is written by Jenni Burke, who also wrote Black Cat Schottische, it is in 6/8 time — a meter we don't play as often as others but should, and because its title is reminds us of the beauty of our Great Lakes.

As I play this I picture myself on a small sailboat skimming across the water, feeling its rhythm as I watch the shoreline. Part B has a different feel – I feel like I am wading in Lake Michigan and getting splashed by waves (the first beat of the first three measures of the last two lines).



HOW FAST IS SOMETHING TO BE PLAYED? THOUGHTS ON TEMPO:

Have you noticed people have strong opinions on the "right" tempo? You hear comments like "it's too fast", "it's too slow" or it's tooo......... So, here is what I notice about tempo:

- Each group with has a different sense of what tempo a tune is played. If playing with a new group, pay attention to their tempo. It likely won't be the same as you are used to so make the effort to play it "their" tempo.
- Tune tempos vary with region
- Tempo styles change with time. For example, Cold Frosty Morn was originally a dirge played after the Battle of Culloden.
- Playing solo or individually allows for greater flexibility of tempo and is adapted to the purpose of the playing. Changing tempos changes the tune. Kay Rowe has taken some tunes we normally play fast and effectively slowed them down when she is playing in a hospice setting. A few people on the Hammered Dulcimer Players FB page were asking for suggestions of what to play at a wedding. A responder said they liked to play Whiskey Before Breakfast slowly and found it to work well.
- Playing too fast makes the tune "muddy," playing too slow can put people to sleep unless you arrange it to include other ear alerts (harmony, featuring different instruments, style).
- If everything is at the same tempo it gets boring and monotonous.

 Hammered dulcimer players tend to push the tempo – and it gets faster and faster......

Summer suggestion: take one of your favorite tunes and play around with the tempo. Do a slow tune fast, a fast tune slow. Change the tempo of the two parts. Start slow in A, play B faster or vice versa. Play the tune as a swing, a jig, a polka. How many variations do you come up with? Second – play a tune to see if you push the tempo? Set a tempo on a metronome and try playing the entire tune at that tempo..........Marsha
