March Tune of the Month is Black Nag. A traditional tune, it first appeared in 1657 in John Playford's 3rd edition of the Dancing Master as "the Galloping Nag." It is a popular tune for English country dancers and American contra dancers. You can find it on YouTube. Although it is listed as an English tune, there is a definite Celtic feel to it.

I have given it to you in two keys: Am and Bm. If playing solo or as a group, it adds interest to change keys. The hammering patterns remains the same. We have done with this with other tunes. Please try it in both keys. There is a different feel to the tune from one key to the other.

Performance notes: We played our "All About Love" playlist at Heartland on Feb. 6. There was one lady who sang along to many of the tunes we played. (At least it seemed so — I could not hear her.) Afterwards I went up to her and complimented her on knowing so many of the tunes. She told me how much she enjoyed the concert, but in truth she didn't know all the words. She said: "I listened to you tell the title of the tune and the few words about it and made up my own words." Her friend added: "Isn't she great?" When we got to "Let Me Call You Sweetheart" I asked how many there had been married over 60 years? At least 6 hands went up, very happy to be asked about the love in their life.


