Performance notes:

Heartland – loved our playset. One gentleman really wanted to buy a CD but said his ex-wife took all his money. Another man in the audience purchased one for the Center to have for patients to check out and listen to. Warmed our hearts.

Christ Episcopal Church – we were the "warm-up" act on a lovely summer evening at a new venue. Heard they want us back next summer.

River Raisin – one "fan" told me she thought we were better than ever. She liked the new tunes, all of the music and mix of instruments. Armed Services Salute and God Bless America were added at the end, were warmly received and climaxed the program in a very fitting way.

MUSIC updates:

Tune of the Month – "(The) Girl I Left Behind Me" – an English folk song with a march beat. It was used by Armies as a marching tune when solders left for war or naval ships set sail. The first print version appeared in Dublin in the late 1700's with a number of versions since. It was thought to come to America during the

War of 1812 when American solders heard a British prisoner singing it. Different lyrics were penned depending on who was singing it and which war. It has been featured in Bugs Bunny and Popeye cartoons, and heard as an overlay in Glenn Miller's arrangement of "American Patrol." It has even been quoted in some pieces of classical music and used in various movies. As you learn this, think what tune you might pair it with in a medley and let me know. I have one in mind. Is your pick the same?

Armed Services Salute has been updated and revised. The vamp between tunes has been removed and the chords have been simplified. Please check Dropbox and make sure you have the updated version.

Corrections: Be aware that corrections are made periodically. Sometimes it is because a chord needs to be changed, sometimes it is because we play it differently than written, sometimes it is wrong notes.

October-November playlist: I have added some of the Evart tunes that were great fun and will spice up the fall play list.

Tentative Christmas holiday list: Note the word "tentative", since details and order may change as we get into rehearsal. However, this is a start to give you time to work on it. Last year each tune had 2 starters, so that will be done again. If there is a tune you can and would like to start, let me know. I will be modifying these as needed. There is one new tune medley, "I Saw Three Ships/Christmas is in The Air." Check Dropbox for the music or let me know if you need a hard copy. Rehearsals will start in October. If there is sufficient need and interest, we can have a workshop in September to go over the new tune, the starts/tempos and arrangements. Give me feedback on this.

- Should the club bring in someone from the outside to do a workshop?

Jamming Progress: The jams keep getting better as we work to overcome and solve the acoustical issues of the space. Each person can help by:

- ✓ Listening If you cannot hear the people next to you, you are playing too loud.
- Listen If you are tuning your instrument during announcements, you are not listening and prevent others from hearing (consider stepping away from the group to do this).

- ✓ Listen -if you can hear the bass, you can keep the beat and it helps you not "push" the tempo.
- ✓ Listen -If you can hear other instruments and your own: that is harmony, that is sweet, that is music and it makes a great jam!
