Grandparents University: Central Michigan University, June 18-19. I have been invited to teach an Introduction to Hammered Dulcimer at this summer camp hosted by the CMU Alumni Association for grandparents with grandchildren between the ages of 9 and 12. It will be the first time that any music class is being offered at this event.

It involves our doing two 90 minute classes on Wednesday afternoon, June 19 and an opportunity to have an open performance jam in the dorm lounge that evening. There is no pay for this "gig" – merely the change to introduce the HD to new generations that are interested in learning. Grandparents who bring their grandchild are invested in their development. They would like to be able to accommodate 30 students (1 grandchild/1 grandparent per dulcimer).

Parking: We will be given parking passes.

Lodging: Camping at Isabella County Fairgrounds to the north of town. If not a camper, there are several motels, including the Soaring Eagle Casino.

Meals: On our own. Will try to organize at least one communal meal. TBD.

Players: Back-up players are welcome and needed. Could use 2-3 more HD players.

Format: Much the same as our library outreach program: 20-25 minutes performance demonstration, followed by Q&A, then 45 minutes to teach "Brother John (Frere Jacques)" which they then would perform. (This is likely to be recorded.)

March Tune of the Month:

"Green Green Grass of Home." This is a familiar tune written by Claude "Curly" Putman, Jr. and recorded in 1965 by Porter Wagoner. Other recordings were done by Jerry Lee Lewis, Joan Baez and Tom Jones. The tune is not difficult and chosen for its "Green" theme as one of the colors for the Evart performance. A parody of the lyrics changing the setting to Evart will go with this tune.

Play lists:

March –The playlist features some our favorites Celtic/Irish tunes.

April- July: Along with favorite tunes, the last set is a Patriotic sendoff.

Evart – Tentative list. The red/black medley to be played will be chosen by consensus of which sounds better. If you are thinking of going to Evart, please sign the interest sheet on the table at the jams.

Library Outreach Playlist: If you have not performed yet, this is a good venue to start. There are fewer tunes to learn. Our first program of the year is May 6 at the Northville Public Library.
