We finished with The Minstrel Boy in gratitude for all those who have served or are serving on the "frontline" whether it is the Armed Services or those on the frontline of this pandemic, "The Parting Glass" as a toast to each other and our musical friendship, and finally, a verse of Amazing Grace that recognizes the difficulties of this year and the presence of grace amidst all the toils and troubles. December Spirit Jam will be on December 17 and be a mix of holiday and traditional favorites. Mark your calendar for 7:00 that night and enjoy an evening of good cheer. Think about participating in the photo collage with a picture of you by a Christmas tree (we won't be able to play in the Parade of Trees this year, but we can create a virtual display if you send your photo). The tune list will come out in a week or so. I usually invite tune choices but this month will assemble it myself as if we were all playing a gig for our club, patrons and fans in a lovely auditorium.

In January we will return to a regular Spirit Jam and those people whose last name starts with Re to Z can submit a tune suggestion for the jam. Make it a musical New Year Resolution of sorts.

Practice Tune Videos - Check the Website every so often for new practice tune videos. An ongoing project, it would go faster if others would offer to create a video of an SSDS tune they know well. You need a smartphone or an HD camera. You have someone else record you or position your device on a tripod so the area of your HD you will be playing on is clear. Format: Announce the tune and key. Play it through at tempo one or two times. Then break down the hammering pattern for the A and B parts. After that, play the tune slowly 2 times and then 2 times closer to the actual tempo. Save your recording to dropbox and then email to Karen (karenturner@comcast.net) to put on the website's video page. Your help with this project is welcomed. This will help the newer members learn some of our tunes. There is no particular order in which the tunes are being added. If you have questions or are ready to contribute to this with a particular tune you love and know - let me know.

HOLIDAY VIDEO GREETINGS -a number of music video greetings cards are being created through the computer wizardry of Cindy Semrau, the efforts of about 20 SSDS members and the coordination of Marsha Kozlowski.
