MARSHA'S MUSINGS Marsha Kozlowski

The holiday performance schedule was grueling, but rewarding in many ways. For the most part, we had great audiences and packed them in. Some of the venues were so happy with us, they have already booked for next December. What was notable was the broad support of the club to make this season so successful. More than 40 of our people came to at least one rehearsal, even though some did not get to actually play a performance. 21 people learned and did at least 1 start (I created starters list for each gig, so everyone who was willing would get to do a start). There were usually 20+ at each performance and I think the fewest we had was 14 people. The individuals changed with each performance, but all pitched in where needed to add the "bells and whistles" and adapted to the unique demands of each venue. People commented to me that it was wonderful to see a group of people who looked like they enjoyed playing and were having fun at it. Thanks to Bill Smith for all the official photographs (and some unofficial).

A look back at 2019:

The monthly **slow jam, coordinated by Linda Osgood,** continues to help newer members. It will start up again in March. The **After Hours Jam** at 9:00 sees a small but dedicated group that shares tunes, works on some of the less often played tunes. Please feel welcome to participate in either or both of these.

2019 Tunes of the Month – There were only 5 new tunes added in 2019, not counting the new tunes added to the Holiday repertoire: Manger Medley, Over the River and Through the Woods (medleyed with Jingle Bells). We tried Christmas Waltz but were unable to bring that to performance level.

- Orange and Blue –a traditional Scottish tune which uses the rhythm pattern known as a sprathspey, it is a 16th note followed by a dotted 8th. We performed this Evart.
- Toora, Loora, Loora an Irish lullaby penned in 1914 by James Royce Shannon of Tin Pan Alley. (sung in the Bing Crosby movie, "Going My Way." and 1983 episode of "Cheer" sung by Carla) I would still like this to be played well enough to include in a March playlist.
- Green, Green Grass of Home a familiar ballad, also performed at Evart.
- Adirondack Cascade a 6/8 jig in Am
- **Willafjord** 4/4 in D fun sea shanty with syncopation. It will be a crowd pleaser.

2020 - First Tune of the Month:

 Yankee Doodle Boy – a George Cohan tune that will be part of our patriotic set (April – July playlist). It is easy to play.

Library Outreach – We did two of these in 2019 at South Lyon Library and Northville library. On the target list: Ypsilanti, Belleville and Canton. If you go to any of those libraries, please drop off a brochure and promote this. These programs have brought a lot of interest to our instruments, our club and given people a nudge to try playing.

Workshops – Last year I wrote about member requests for some workshops. This never really went anywhere. If there is still interest, let the Board know. Last year people were interested in: "Improving back-up playing", "Improving starts," Bones, Bowed Psaltery, Spoons, Bodhran and/or Cajon Box.

CMU Grandparents University – about 8 from our club were joined by musical friends from around the state to conduct 2 classes on an afternoon at this event in June. It was a great hit. The children and their grandparents learned to play "Brother John" or as it was earlier known, "Frere Jacques.' I have heard from CMU who is inviting us to do this again. Getting to know you...

Stephen Beck - VP Business

I play Hammered Dulcimer, Mountain Dulcimer, Indian Flute, Piano, Guitar, Trumpet and Drums. My musical journey started with my grandma and aunt in 1954. In the 60s I played with folk groups and Rock bands at school, church and college. I worked for Decca Records Instrumentals as a sound engineer. I learned about Silver Strings from people I took a hammered dulcimer class with at Greenfield Village. I joined in 1993, paid my dues for several years, but didn't have much time to come, and now that I'm retired, I'm back. I love the music. I am the new Vice President of Business for SSDS.

One of 10 children, I was born in Galion Ohio, moved to Toledo, Dearborn and Allen Park. I met my wife, Karen, at a Christian camp, when I tried to hitch a ride to a commune in Colorado. I missed my ride and we've been together for 51 years (married for 48). We have 3 sons, and a daughter at New York University who runs the disability student group.

I earned a music degree at Henry Ford Community College, then studied at Michigan Theological Seminary for 7 years, where I became their Financial Aid / Information Systems / Operations Director, designing their catalog, website, flyers, brochures & promotional displays.

I love photography, and many of my pictures have been used in newspapers, TV shows, sports journals, college catalogs, magazines, displays, flyers, brochures and websites. I've done work for Allen Park High School, Urban Farming, "Ambassador", "ICON", "Essence" and "Relish" Magazines, Montel Williams, Jay Leno, Channel 2 News, News Herald, a (French) Liberation Newspaper, Associated Press, Festival of Trees and Northridge Church.

I've been a Senior Computer System Analyst (programmer / computer tech.), working with banks, the US government, and Michigan Consolidated Gas Company. I've tested and reviewed programs for computer magazines, and developed new software for banking, accounting and the Microsoft Corporation. I created Global Tech. Ministries, and established worldwide learning labs, doing software & hardware procurement, training, trouble shooting and repair, and preventive maintenance. I was also a park ranger, flying a helicopter over Yellowstone & the Grand Canyon.

My travels have included Viet Nam in 1968 as a photographer for the Associated Press, skiing in the Swiss Alps and Colorado, Utah, Michigan and Vermont. I've traveled 12 states in the west and 10 states in the east.

Since retirement I have enjoyed my photography, leather working, book repair, rock collecting and polishing, balloon sculpture, music, involvement with my church, a Bible study group, and a Christian car repair group. I don't have much time to get bored.
